## 1860

### NON-POPULATION CENSUS SCHEDULES FOR AGRICULTURE AND MANUFACTURES

From 1850-1880 the United States Census Bureau conducted census survey's for farming and manufacturing operations in conjunction with its regular census and its slave census of the same years. In 1860 the census bureau recorded data in the following information categories. The answers were for the production of the farm during the year ending on June 1, 1860.

Of course not all products applied to all farms or even regions of the nation, and the smallest farms were left out entirely. The Census taker recorded this information supplemental to his regular census duties, and it seems that the information was then recorded in a larger book. The information from the 1860 Agricultural census seems to have been much more carefully recorded and maintained than that of the 1850 Smith County Census. All of the Denney and related references are from the South Division of Smith County. Jefferson Jones was the assistant marshal who recorded the data.
